Once the house was transported and put in place, the Thompsons set to work. The building's original beaded-board walls, huge double-hung windows, and heart-pine floors were in surprisingly good shape, but other structural elements, such as the exterior siding and the crumbling roof, had to be replaced. Furthermore, what the schoolhouse's interior offered in charm, it lacked in function. The two-room building had no kitchen or baths, and the layout wasn't suitable for a family of four. (The Thompsons have two daughters: Bel, 13, and deRosset, 10.) "We wanted to preserve the integrity of the structure without altering it, but the existing space just wasn't enough," says Gale.

Instead of enlarging the house's original footprint, the couple decided it would be simpler to break through to the attic. "We realized we could cut a hole in the ceiling for a staircase and easily add bedrooms and a bath for the girls under the pitched ceilings," says Gale. To make room on the main level, the couple removed half of a wall that ran through the middle of the schoolhouse to create an L-shaped kitchen, living, and dining space; the remaining corner of the rectangular building was enclosed for a master bedroom and bath. A screened porch now wraps around two sides of the house, increasing the living space to 2,400 square feet. "Because of the humidity, we tend to open up all the

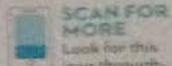
